Golf Course Rules and Regulations

HOURS OF OPERATION

April and October...Noon to 5:00PM (Mondays- except Holidays)
9:00AM to 5:00PM (Tuesday—Sunday)
May—September...Noon to 7:00PM (Mondays—except Holidays)
8:00AM to 7:00PM (Tuesday—Friday)
7:00AM to 7:00PM (Weekends and Holidays)

Tee times are requested and may be reserved by calling the Pro Shop up to one week in advance. Special tee time arrangements may be made through the Pro Shop. All members and guests must register in the Pro Shop prior to teeing off.

TEE OFF RULES

All players must begin play from the 1st tee unless otherwise authorized by the Pro Shop. The order of play is designated by the scheduled tee times. Groups are limited up to foursomes. However, <u>only</u> at the discretion of the Golf Professional will fivesomes be permitted.

PRIORITY ON THE

In the absence of special rules, priority on the course will be in the following order: foursomes, threesomes, twosomes, and singles. Groups of three or less may experience some delay.

During high traffic periods, the Pro Shop is authorized to match up groups of three or less to best utilize the course in order to accommodate all golfers.

JUNIOR GOLFERS

Junior golfers age 14 and under accompanied by an adult or certified may start play:

- ™ Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday anytime
- Thursday before 10:30 a.m. and finished by 12:30 p.m. and after 5:30 p.m.
- Saturday, Sunday, Holidays after 11:00 a.m.
- Junior players will abide by all the Rules and Regulations established by the Club and shall be responsible to make tee times and register in the Pro Shop before play.
- Junior players must comply with the Club dress code.
- Junior players must permit adult players to play through.
- Junior players that are certified must maintain a current USGA golf handicap and must post and adjust all scores (9 and 18 holes) as required in the Pro Shop.
- Children age 4 and under are not permitted on the golf course or practice facilities at any time.

JUNIOR GOLF PROGRAM

The Junior Golf Program begins this season on Wed., July 6th. All levels will meet each Wednesday in July, the 6th—27th from 8a.m.-10a.m. for instruction and play. All areas of golf will be covered from rules and etiquette to technique including, driving, chipping, putting and game management. The 27th will include an awards ceremony and cookout.

The cost for the program is \$40 per child member or non-membe Members are encouraged to bring their non-member friends. Ages and up welcome!

GUEST RULES

guests must check in at the Pro Shop before play and pay the appropriate fees.

guests must be accompanied by or sponsored by a member in good standing to be entitled to play.

e sponsoring member will be responsible for all fees or charges incurred by their guest/s or any damages to the Club property caused by their guest/s.

embers are responsible for advising their guests of Club policies and dress code.

WEATHER DELAYS

In the event of inclement weather or frost delays, the order of play will be determined by the Golf Committee or Golf Professional.

PACE OF PLAY

4 HOURS

The USGA pace of play rating for Pennhills is 3 hours, 57 minutes total time.

An undelayed round is an important tradition of the Club. Your place on the course is directly behind the group in front of you, not directly ahead of the group behind you. Play without delay.

Whenever a match shall for any reason fall more than one clear hole behind the players ahead, it is expected to invite the following match through.

Four hours is sufficient time for a foursome to finish 18 holes.

DRESS CODE

The following outlines the dress requirements for both male and female members and guests while on the golf course:

Men

acks (no denim)

rmuda-style shorts (no more than four inches above the knee)

olf shirts with collars

rtle-necks and mock-turtles

Non-metal spikes

Ladies

irts

ousers (no denim)

rmuda-style shorts (length of which should be no shorter than halfway between mid-thigh and the knee)

llared golf shirts.

llarless golf shirts with sleeves and similar sleeveless shirts with collars are acceptable for ladies Non-metal spikes

Juniors

Juniors and children are expected to be dressed in a manner consistent with these guidelines.

The Professional staff has been asked to provide any further guidance as deemed necessary and to bring to the attention of members any departure from these standards.



GOLF LEAGUE/MGA SCHEDULES

The League nines designated for play each week are closed for League participants that evening. All other golfers will play the other nine as follows:

<u>League Front</u> - Holes 2-10 <u>League Back</u> - Holes 1, 11-18

Hole #1 is NOT to be played as a practice hole on the way to holes 2-10 (Front 9) regardless if there are no players on the first tee. If in doubt check with the Pro Shop. Your cooperation is necessary.

Men's League:

Tuesday 9 Hole League Play. Starting times are 4:00 - 6:00 p.m.

Women's League:

Wednesday 9 Hole League Play. Starting times are 4:00 - 6:00 p.m.

MGA Day:

Thursday is Men's MGA Day. The events are 1:00 p.m. shotgun starts, unless scheduled otherwise. Members not participating are required to finish play by 12:00 noon.

COURSE CLOSINGS AND CART

The Green Chairman and/or Golf Course Superintendent have complete authority to determine if weather and/or course conditions are suitable for play and/or cart usage.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

The Golf and/or Green Committees reserve the right to suspend or cancel any event or play due to inclement weather or life threatening conditions.

Discontinue Play Immediately - 1 prolonged note of siren **Resumption of Play** - 2 short notes of siren

COURSE ETIQUETTE

- ch player must have a set of clubs and golf bag. more than 2 bags and 2 riders per car.
- olf car drivers, who rent cars, must be 16+ years of age and possess a valid driver's license and provide it if requested.
- n-playing riders will not be charged.
- ep all cars 30 feet from greens and on paths where provided. Avoid soft turf and wet low lying areas. Obey cart signs.
- pair ball marks; yours and at least one other.
- place divots and use divot mix where provided.
- ke bunkers after play and leave rakes where originally found.
- ching and chipping limited to 30 foot radius around the putting green.
- private coolers or ice chests. All food and beverages must be purchased from the Pennhills Club. P.L.C.B. regulations prohibit open liquor bottles on club property and also transporting liquor on to the premises by a member or guest.

HANDICAPS

Golf handicap indexes are maintained through the Pro Shop. Posting will begin April 1st and will be updated thirteen times throughout the season until October 1st. To maintain an accurate index, golfers <u>must enter their</u> adjusted score after each round in the Pro Shop. Proper posting procedures will be posted in the Pro Shop along with the events that constitute tournament scores. Each adult golf member will be charged \$35 to maintain a USGA handicap index, non-member cost is \$45. This fee includes membership in the Western Pennsylvania Golf Association, computer hardware maintenance, software upgrades, offsets printing costs as well as tournament/event programs and permits golfers to participate in club events.

WEEKEND SWEEPS

Throughout the season, the Pro Shop will offer both individual and team sweeps along with other events on the weekends. These shall include sweeps for individual low gross and net classes based on handicap and other events. Sign-up in the Pro Shop before teeing off. Prizes will be awarded in Pro Shop credit. Scores must be posted for prize eligibility by 5:00 p.m. in the Pro Shop. Guests with a certified USGA index may participate when accompanied by a member. In addition to sweeps, special team events will be offered throughout the season.

To participate in these events you must play with another member.

PRO SHOP CREDIT & PRIZE CERTIFICATES

Prizes for most Club events will be awarded in Pro Shop credit or prize certificates. Credit or Prize certificates may be applied to any purchase, sale items or special orders. Credit may not be transferred between accounts. All credit earned April 1st through June 30th will expire July 31st. All credit earned July 1st through September 14th will expire Friday, October 21st.
